"FRIENDS AND COMPANIONS"

WHAT KIND OF FRIEND AM I?

In our study of Proverbs we learn that we need a COMPANION as we travel down life's road. Who should this COMPANION be (Proverbs 3:13-18; 8:1-12)? ________ In our life we need a close friend and companion. We have a need to find someone whom we can trust and spend time with and talk to and confide in and relax with and share those things that are on our hearts. In this study we want to think about our friends in light of God's Word. Think of this: "What kind of a friend am I?"

I. AVOID THE WRONG COMPANIONS

CHOOSING

The choice of who our friends and companions are is very important. It is very important to give careful thought and consideration as to who a life's companion should be (husband or wife), but sometimes we think that it does not matter very much when it comes to choosing other friends and companions. The book of Proverbs makes it very clear that our choice of friends is *very* important.

Before you decide to spend a good deal of time with someone, you mu	ust first decide what kind of a person he or
she is. What kind of persons are described in Proverbs 24:1?

It important to <i>avoid</i> being with and spending time with certain kinds of people. People affect and influence other people.
What kind of person should you <i>not</i> choose as your friend and companion (Proverbs 13:20)?
If the one who walks with the wise is wise (Proverbs 13:20), then what do you think is true of the one who walks with the foolish?
We need to make sure we walk down life's pathway with the right kind of people. What happens when you walk with a person and spend time with a person? Think of your own close friends (or friend) that you have walked with for weeks and months and perhaps even years. Do you ever find that you begin talking like your friend? Do you find yourself thinking as he (or she) does? Do you find yourself acting like your friend in certain ways? Have you followed your friend or copied him (or her) in certain ways? Have you been influenced by your friend? Overall, has this been a good or a harmful influence? Has your friend become like you in certain ways? Think of this: In what ways have you influenced him or her? (<i>That question is for your own thoughts.</i>)
If we want to be WISE, what kind of friend should we choose (Proverbs 13:20)?
The question is: How can I get that kind of a friend? How can I attract a wise person so that he or she will want to be my friend? The answer is very simple: wise attracts wise! To attract a wise person I must <i>be</i> a wise person! If a person is wise then he too will be looking for a wise person (because he realizes the truth of Proverbs 13:20). I need to be the person he (or she) is looking for!
What is another kind of person who should be avoided as a friend (Proverbs 22:24)?
What is another kind of person who should be avoided as a friend (Proverbs 28:7)?
(<i>Note</i> : The term " <i>riotous</i> " means " <i>gluttonous</i> " and refers to one who eats too much and lacks self control.) What is yet another kind of person who should be avoided as a friend (Proverbs 23:20)?
If we join in with this kind of a person and establish a close friendship with them, what will happen? <i>The answer</i> : Will we begin to imitate them and copy them and be like them? The general rule is this: <i>WE BECOME LIKE OUR FRIENDS</i> .
Avoiding certain people as friends does not mean that we are to be unfriendly or unconcerned towards anyone. God has a love and a concern that reaches out to every person (John 3:16; Matthew 5:45; etc.), and we ought to reach out in love and concern to every person. In a good and healthy way we should be friendly towards all, but we should become close friends and companions only with the wise (Proverbs 13:20).
II. CHOOSE THE RIGHT COMPANIONS
Actually, choosing the right kind of person as your friend is not as difficult as it may seem. It is very easy to get rid of the wrong kind of friends. All I need to do is to concentrate on being the right kind of person myself. For example, would a fool want to be a wise man's companion? Would an evil men want a righteous man for a companion? Would Cain want Abel for a companion? Would the Pharisees want the Lord Jesus for a Companion? When it comes to forming friendships, fools attract fools, wise men attract wise men, evil men attract evil men, righteous men attract righteous men, etc. Also wise men will usually REPEL fools. The fool will not normally want to be in the company of a wise man. What kind of friend are you
