

## The Scope of Our Salvation

Ephesians 3:12-21

It is a good life living for the Lord, and I can't impress upon your heart enough today as a Christian that you serve the Lord today. Get the job done. Let God work through your heart to see other individuals come to a saving knowledge of Jesus, and then He can use you also to help other Christians, those who have maybe drifted away from Him, help them to understand that they're not lost. They have simply left their first love. In other words, they have gotten away from God, and their fellowship needs to be restored today. Let God use you in his service.

And then I understand that there may be some listening today who have never trusted Jesus as Savior. My heart's desire is that you would call upon Him today, receive Him as your Lord and Savior because He's the only way that any of us will ever see Heaven.

We're going to look today in Ephesians chapter 3. And let me remind you that these Scriptures that I'm giving you can be found on our website, and I realize that we go through these Scriptures quickly, so therefore you won't be able to write all of them down. Now, in Ephesians chapter 3, we want to look today at the scope of our salvation. Look with

me in verses 18 and 19. It says: *May be able to comprehend ....talking about us....with all saints what [is] the breadth, and length, and depth, and height;* <sup>19</sup> *And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God.*

Notice the word there, *knowledge....that passeth knowledge*. Human beings without Jesus Christ cannot understand the fullness or the immenseness of the salvation that comes through Jesus Christ. And today we want to look at the scope of our salvation, the bigness of it, how it is spread out, how that God has blessed us with this salvation, first of all, in salvation past.

In I Corinthians chapter 15 and verse 3, the Bible says, *For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures*. Christ died for our sins. He paid the penalty for our sins.

In II Corinthians chapter 5 and verse 21, we read there that the full penalty was paid in our stead and this is substitution. It says, *For he hath made him [to be] sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him*. We have passed from death unto life because Jesus has paid the penalty of sin in our stead. We do not have to give an account of that sin ever in our lives here or in Heaven, because Jesus paid the penalty.

And then in Galatians chapter 3 and verse 13, it says, *Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed [is] every one that hangeth on a tree*. This verse teaches us that we have been adopted into the family of God. Adoption....we have been redeemed. We have been relieved or taken away from the curse of the law that says, *All have sinned and come short of the glory of*

*God (Romans 3:23), and because of that sin, all will die. But all do not die who receive Jesus as Savior, because Jesus Christ has redeemed us from the curse of sin, the curse of the law.*

And then notice with me the glory of the cross in Colossians chapter 1 and verse 20. The Bible says, *And, having made peace through the blood of his cross, by him to reconcile all things unto himself; by him, [I say], whether [they be] things in earth, or things in heaven.* This is reconciliation. We have been reconciled to God by the blood of Jesus Christ. We no longer have to depend upon anyone, anything else, the law or anything to save us, because nothing else can save us. It's all through Jesus Christ. It's salvation past for those of us who have trusted Him as our Savior. Jesus died once for all. He died once. He died for all who would call upon His name and receive Him as Savior.

Notice with me now, salvation present. In Ephesians chapter 1 and verse 18 through 20. You can read that later on if you would. The Bible verses there teach us that Christ lives in us. In John chapter 14 verses 16 through 18, the Bible teaches us that the Holy Spirit lives within us because Jesus sent the Holy Spirit.

In John chapter 14, verses 16 through 18, it says, *And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; <sup>17</sup>[Even] the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. <sup>18</sup>I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you.* Jesus did not leave us comfortless. When he went back to Heaven, He sent the Holy Spirit to fill us, to empower us, to give us the assurance of our salvation because as we read further in the Scriptures in John chapter 16, verses 13 through 15, we see that the Holy Spirit has been given to us as a guide. *Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth:*

*for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, [that] shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come. <sup>14</sup>He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew [it] unto you. <sup>15</sup>All things that the Father hath are mine: therefore said I, that he shall take of mine, and shall shew [it] unto you (John 16:13).*

The Holy Spirit came. Jesus kept His word. The Holy Spirit has come. He lives within us. He lives within us as our guide. And then we see in Romans chapter 8 and verse 2 that He came and He is also our guide. In chapter 8, He is our assurance. In chapter 8 and verse 2, it says, *For the law of the spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.* Notice verse 14 of chapter 8 of Romans. *For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.* We are free from the law. We are free from the curse, once for all.

And in Colossians chapter 1, verses 23 through 27, the Bible says, *If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and [be] not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, [and] which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister; <sup>24</sup>Who now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up that which is behind of the afflictions of Christ in my flesh for his body's sake, which is the church: <sup>25</sup>Whereof I am made a minister, according to the dispensation of God which is given to me for you, to fulfil the word of God; <sup>26</sup>[Even] the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations, but now is made manifest to his saints: <sup>27</sup>To whom God would make known what [is] the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.*

Jesus Christ is our assurance today. He has given us not the spirit of fear but the spirit of power and of knowledge and of hope and knowing that He is our Savior....I Timothy

chapter 1 and verse 1: *Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the commandment of God our Saviour, and Lord Jesus Christ, [which is] our hope.*

*So then faith [cometh] by hearing, and hearing by the word of God* (Romans 10:17). Hope, faith becomes substance that we know through the Holy Spirit that we have eternal life and we have that life right now. Salvation past, Jesus died for us. Salvation present, the Holy Spirit lives in us to guide us, to help us, and to give us full assurance that we are saved.

And then we see salvation future. Christ is coming for us. Notice with me if you would in Titus chapter 2 and verse 13, *Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ.* We are to look for the Lord.

In Acts chapter 1 and verse 11, after Jesus was starting to ascend and after He ascended up into the heavens, after His crucifixion and His appearing to the apostles, to the disciples there, in Acts chapter 1 and verse 11, the angel said, "Why stand ye here gazing up into the clouds? This same Jesus which is taken up from you shall in like manner come again." I'm looking for Jesus today to come in the clouds. I'm not looking to taste death today, because some of us who are alive and those of us who have trusted Jesus Christ as our Savior, those of us who are alive at His coming for His people will not taste death, but we will be changed in the moment in the twinkling of an eye.

In I Thessalonians chapter 4 and verse 18, it says, *Wherefore comfort one another with these words.* What words? That Jesus is coming for us and we shall see Him soon.

And not only that. One of the happiest things, one of the most joyous things that a Christian can be happy about is that we shall be present with our Lord forever. We shall behold and

partake of the eternal glory of Christ. John chapter 17 and verse 24, says, *Father, I will that they also, whom thou hast given me, be with me where I am; that they may behold my glory, which thou hast given me: for thou lovedst me before the foundation of the world.*

Salvation past, Jesus died for us. Salvation present, Christ lives in us through the Holy Spirit. Salvation future, Christ is coming for us, for the saved people, for those people who have trusted Him as their Savior. And my question today for you is this: Are you saved? Do you know Jesus as your Savior? Have you taken advantage of that salvation that Jesus is offering so freely? *For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: [it is] the gift of God* (Ephesians 2:8).

Pray something like this: "Lord Jesus, I know I can't save myself. Please come into my heart. I receive You as my Lord and Savior right now."

If the Holy Spirit has convicted your heart today and let you know that you are lost and you need Jesus, ask Jesus to come into your heart right now. He won't refuse you. You don't have to pray a certain prayer. It's the condition of your heart by saying, "Jesus, I receive You as my Savior. Please save me and take me to Heaven."

If you are a saved person and you're not serving Him today, may I invite you to get things right with Him today. "Lord Jesus, forgive me. I know I've done wrong. I have not been serving You. Please forgive me that I can serve You from this point on for Your sake. Amen."
